ORDER OF INDEFINITE SUSPENSION

On May 13, 2026, this Court issued an Order to Show Cause requiring attorney Thomas H. Dale to show cause why he should not be disciplined on account of his conduct in appeal *United States v. Joshua Davis*, No. 25-14018. According to the Order to Show Cause, Dale failed to comply with the Court's rules and orders and the Clerk's Office's multiple notices and failed to file a corrected *Anders* brief and an appendix in No. 25-14018.

The Order to Show Cause states that “[i]f Dale fails to file a verified response within fourteen (14) days of the date of this Order, he shall be indefinitely suspended from practice before this Court.” According to the Clerk’s records, on May 13, 2026, the Order to Show Cause was electronically filed on the docket in 26-804 and a copy thereof was sent, via regular mail, to Dale’s address of record with this Court and with the Florida Bar.

On June 3, 2026, the Clerk’s Office received as “not deliverable” the Court’s Order to Show Cause, which was mailed to counsel on May 13, 2026. No response to the Order to Show Cause was received from counsel.

Pursuant to Addendum Eight of the Rules of the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Eleventh Circuit, IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that Thomas H. Dale is INDEFINITELY SUSPENDED from practice before this Court, effective immediately.
