
B Y T H E C O U R T :

It is called to the attention of the court that in General Order No. 1, second paragraph, sixth indented paragraph thereunder, concerning the right of a district judge member of the Judicial Council to succeed himself, the language does not clearly cover the situation arising if a district judge member selected for a one-year period, or a district judge member selected for a two-year period, does not serve out the term for which he has been selected and is succeeded by another district judge for the unexpired portion of such period.

It is, therefore, ORDERED that this sixth indented paragraph under the second paragraph of General Order No. 1 is amended to read as follows:

A district judge member may not succeed himself, provided however, that the district judge Council member selected for a one-year period (and his successor for any unexpired portion thereof) shall be eligible to serve an additional three-year successive term and that the district judge Council member selected for a period of two years (and his successor for any unexpired portion thereof) shall be eligible to serve an additional three-year successive term. The district judge member selected for an initial three-year period shall not be eligible to serve a successive term.
