GENERAL ORDER NO. 54

ORDER REGARDING COVID-19

This General Order is issued after consideration of the updated guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (“CDC”) and other local, regional, and national government officials regarding the COVID-19 pandemic. It is hereby ORDERED, effective Thursday, September 8, 2022, that:

- General Order 53, entered on December 27, 2021, is VACATED. General Order 44, General Order 46, General Order 49, General Order 50, General Order 51 (Amended), and General Order 52 remain vacated.
- The Circuit Executive, in consultation with the Chief Judge, is directed to determine what building entry, masking, and social distancing requirements, if any, are appropriate and post those requirements on the Eleventh Circuit’s web site and at building entrances. The decisions regarding what requirements, if any, to impose shall be made based on all relevant guidance, including that from the CDC. All court staff, on-site contractors, and visitors must comply with posted signs and any screening requirements.
- The United States Marshals Service, through its Court Security Officer program, is responsible for enforcing the posted entry restrictions.
- By entering court facilities, all individuals are self-certifying that they meet the requirements for doing so and that they will comply with posted signs.
- A list of all relevant contacts and telephone numbers for all court units will be posted. Any visitor or vendor denied building entry will be asked to contact the appropriate court unit for further instructions.
