ORDER
("Complainant") has filed this Complaint against United States District Judge (the "Subject Judge"), pursuant to Chapter 16 of Title 28 U.S.C. § 351(a) and the Rules for Judicial-Conduct and Judicial-Disability Proceedings of the Judicial Conference of the United States ("JCDR").
Background
The record shows that in July 2014 Complainant filed a prisoner civil rights action against multiple defendants, generally alleging that he was in imminent danger of physical injury, and he later filed a motion for leave to file an amended complaint. In September 2014 a district judge who is not the Subject Judge dismissed the case without prejudice under 28 U.S.C. § 1915(g) and because venue was not proper.
Complainant filed a notice of appeal, and this Court later clerically dismissed the appeal for want of prosecution. Complainant then filed another notice of appeal, and in August 2015 the Subject Judge entered an order reassigning the case to a different district judge. This Court later clerically dismissed Complainant's second appeal for want of prosecution.
The record shows that Complainant filed another case in the district court, but the Subject Judge was not involved in that case.
Complaint
In his Complaint of Judicial Misconduct or Disability, Complainant appears to allege that the Subject Judge and others violated his civil rights "by desegregating self-discriminating U.S. District Courts of capital cases" He states that the Subject Judge

and other judges "attacked [him] by physical injuries of harm immin[en]t danger of physical injuries motivated by evil motive when they knew he . . . was in danger "

Discussion

Complainant provides no credible facts or evidence in support of his claims that the Subject Judge engaged in misconduct.

The Complaint "is based on allegations lacking sufficient evidence to raise an inference that misconduct has occurred or that a disability exists," JCDR 11(c)(1)(D). For that reason, pursuant to Chapter 16 of Title 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(iii) and Rule 11(c)(1)(D) of the Rules for Judicial-Conduct and Judicial-Disability Proceedings of the Judicial Conference of the United States, this Complaint is **DISMISSED**.
