## Judicial Complaint No. 11-19-90093

IN THE MATTER OF A COMPLAINT FILED BY
IN RE: The Complaint of against United States Circuit Judge of the United States Court of Appeals for the Circuit, under the Judicial Conduct and Disability Act of 1980, Chapter 16 of Title 28 U.S.C. §§ 351-364.
ORDER
Judge, pursuant to Chapter 16 of Title 28 U.S.C. § 351(a) and the Rules for Judicial-Conduct and Judicial-Disability Proceedings of the Judicial Conference of the United States ("JCDR").
Background
In April 2019 Complainant filed a Complaint of Judicial Misconduct or Disability against a United States Magistrate Judge and a United States District Judge.

### Complaint

In the instant Complaint of Judicial Misconduct or Disability, Complainant alleges the Subject Judge engaged in "willful delay" in reviewing his previous Complaint. He also alleges the Judicial Council illegally and "conspiratorially" "further[ed] the delay in reviewing the subject complaint in order to conceal the criminal acts committed by those involved," and failed to investigate the Subject Judge's actions. Finally, Complainant states the Judicial Conference must ensure that a special grand jury is convened so he can present evidence of crimes committed against him.

### **Discussion**

Complainant provides no credible facts or evidence in support of his allegation that the Subject Judge engaged in "willful delay" in reviewing his previous Complaint of Judicial Misconduct or Disability.

The Complaint "is based on allegations lacking sufficient evidence to raise an inference that misconduct has occurred or that a disability exists," JCDR 11(c)(1)(D). For that reason, pursuant to Chapter 16 of Title 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(iii) and Rule 11(c)(1)(D) of the Rules for Judicial-Conduct and Judicial-Disability Proceedings of the Judicial Conference of the United States, this Complaint is **DISMISSED**.
