("Complainant") has filed this Complaint against United States District Judge (the "Subject Judge"), pursuant to Chapter 16 of Title 28 U.S.C. § 351(a) and the Rules for Judicial-Conduct and Judicial-Disability Proceedings of the Judicial Conference of the United States ("JCDR").
Background
The record shows that in August 2020 Complainant filed a lawsuit against two defendants, and in November 2020 the Subject Judge issued an order dismissing the case for failure to prosecute and failure to comply with court orders.
Complaint
The Complaint of Judicial Conduct or Disability is composed of a complaint form and a docket sheet from a lawsuit Complainant filed that did not involve the Subject Judge.
Discussion
Complainant provides no credible facts or evidence in support of a claim that the Subject Judge engaged in misconduct.

The Complaint "is based on allegations lacking sufficient evidence to raise an

inference that misconduct has occurred or that a disability exists," JCDR 11(c)(1)(D). For that reason, pursuant to Chapter 16 of Title 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(iii) and Rule

11(c)(1)(D) of the Rules for Judicial-Conduct and Judicial-Disability Proceedings of the Judicial Conference of the United States, this Complaint is DISMISSED .
