("Complainant") has filed this Complaint against United States Circuit Judges,,, and and United States District Judges,,,,,,,

(collectively, the "Subject Judges"), pursuant to Chapter 16 of Title 28 U.S.C. § 351(a) and the Rules for Judicial-Conduct and Judicial-Disability Proceedings of the Judicial Conference of the United States ("JCDR").
Background
The record shows that in 2015 Complainant filed in this Court a petition for writ of mandamus, and in August 2016 a panel composed of Judges and dismissed the petition for lack of jurisdiction. The record also shows that in May 2020 Complainant filed a lawsuit in the United States District Court for the District of naming the chief judges of all the circuit courts and others as defendants,

and a district judge who is not one of the Subject Judges dismissed the complaint as not properly before the court.

Complaint

The Complaint of Judicial Misconduct or Disability is composed of various documents, and it does not contain any allegations that pertain to the Subject Judges.

Discussion

Complainant provides no credible facts or evidence in support of a claim that the Subject Judges engaged in misconduct.

The Complaint "is based on allegations lacking sufficient evidence to raise an inference that misconduct has occurred or that a disability exists," JCDR 11(c)(1)(D). For that reason, pursuant to Chapter 16 of Title 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(iii) and Rule 11(c)(1)(D) of the Rules for Judicial-Conduct and Judicial-Disability Proceedings of the Judicial Conference of the United States, this Complaint is **DISMISSED**.
