ORDER

An individual has filed a Complaint against a United States district judge under the Judicial Conduct and Disability Act of 1980, 28 U.S.C. §§ 351–364, and the Rules for Judicial-Conduct and Judicial-Disability Proceedings of the Judicial Conference of the United States.

Background

In his judicial complaint, Complainant indicates that his complaint involves the revocation of his supervised release. The record shows that in April 2022 the Subject Judge entered a Judgment for Revocation, finding Complainant violated the terms and conditions of his supervised release, revoking his period of supervised release, and sentencing him to “credit time served” along with 24 months of supervised release. (S.D. Fla., No. 1:17-cr-20716-KMM, Doc. 187).

Complaint

Complainant states he is “filing for Quantum Meruit” relief and that “Free Moorish Nationals” are “excluded from Union States Republic.” He does not raise any specific allegations against the Subject Judge.

Discussion

Complainant provides no credible facts or evidence in support of a claim that the Subject Judge engaged in misconduct.

The Complaint “is based on allegations lacking sufficient evidence to raise an inference that misconduct has occurred or that a disability exists,” under Judicial-Conduct Rule 11(c)(1)(D). For that reason, this Complaint is **DISMISSED**.
