ORDER

An individual has filed a Complaint against a United States circuit judge under the Judicial Conduct and Disability Act of 1980, 28 U.S.C. §§ 351–364, and the Rules for Judicial-Conduct and Judicial-Disability Proceedings of the Judicial Conference of the United States.

Background

The record shows that Complainant appealed a certain district court decision, and he filed on appeal a “Motion Requesting Stay of Appeal Until Senate Judiciary Subcommittee Ruling on Request for Judicial Review.” The motion remains pending.


Complaint

Complainant alleges the Subject Judge deliberately delayed ruling on his motion to stay to avoid having to order the district

court to reopen certain cases. He attached documents to his Complaint.

Discussion

The Complaint fails to present a basis for a finding of misconduct. Complainant's allegation lacks sufficient evidence to raise an inference that the Subject Judge acted with an illicit or improper motive. Judicial-Conduct Rule 11(c)(1)(D). For this reason, the Complaint is **DISMISSED**.
