MEMORANDUM TO COUNSEL OR PARTIES

For the purpose of the upcoming en banc rehearing in the above referenced case, the court desires for counsel to focus their briefs on the following issue:

Is the good-faith exception to the exclusionary rule a proper ground for affirming Campbell's conviction despite the government's failure to raise that alternative ground before the panel?

APPELLANT'S EN BANC BRIEF SHALL BE SERVED AND ELECTRONICALLY FILED ON OR BEFORE FEBRUARY 16, 2021. APPELLEE'S EN BANC BRIEF SHALL BE SERVED AND ELECTRONICALLY FILED ON OR BEFORE MARCH 18, 2021.

An en banc reply brief shall be electronically filed on or before April 8, 2021. **NO EXTENSIONS WILL BE GRANTED.** Parties should format their briefs according to Federal Rules of Appellate Procedure 28 and 32 and shall contain the title "En Banc Brief". Each brief must adhere to the page and type-volume limitations Rule 32(a)(7). Fifteen (15) copies of the en banc briefs should be filed (appellant's in blue covers, appellee's in red covers and any reply in gray covers). Counsel is expected to serve all parties a copy of their brief before the close of business on the day of filing. PAPER COPIES OF THE BRIEFS SHOULD BE RECEIVED BY THE NEXT BUSINESS DAY. The filing of an en banc amicus brief is governed by 11th Cir.R.35-8.

Oral argument will be conducted the week of June 14, 2021 in Atlanta, Georgia. Each party will be allotted twenty (20) minutes per side for oral argument. It has not been determined at this

time if oral argument will be held remotely or in person. Counsel will receive subsequent correspondence regarding the specific time of oral argument.
