APPELLANT'S EN BANC BRIEF SHALL BE SERVED AND ELECTRONICALLY FILED ON OR BEFORE NOVEMBER 23, 2020. APPELLEE'S EN BANC BRIEF SHALL BE SERVED AND ELECTRONICALLY FILED ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 23, 2020. An en banc reply brief shall be electronically filed on or before January 13, 2021. **NO EXTENSIONS WILL BE GRANTED.** Parties should format their briefs according to Federal Rules of Appellate Procedure 28 and 32 and shall contain the title "En Banc Brief". Each brief must adhere to the page and type-volume limitations Rule 32(a)(7). Twenty (20) copies of the en banc briefs should be filed (appellant's in blue covers, appellee's in red covers and any reply in gray covers). Counsel is expected to serve all parties a copy of their brief before the close of business on the day of filing. PAPER COPIES OF THE BRIEFS SHOULD BE RECEIVED BY THE NEXT BUSINESS DAY. The filing of an en banc amicus brief is governed by 11th Cir.R.35-8.

Oral argument will be conducted the week of February 22, 2021 in Atlanta, Georgia. Each party will be allotted twenty (20) minutes per side for oral argument. Counsel will receive subsequent correspondence regarding the specific time of oral argument.
