**ORDER**

\_\_\_\_\_ (“Complainant”) has filed this Complaint against United States District Judge \_\_\_\_\_ (the “Subject Judge”), pursuant to Chapter 16 of Title 28 U.S.C. § 351(a) and the Rules for Judicial-Conduct and Judicial-Disability Proceedings of the Judicial Conference of the United States (“JCDR”).

Background

The record shows that in April 2015 Complainant filed a complaint and an amended complaint against multiple defendants, raising various allegations. The Subject Judge was the district judge assigned to the case.


Complaint

In her Complaint of Judicial Misconduct or Disability, Complainant alleges that the Subject Judge engaged in “criminal misconduct . . . in connection with” the case. Complainant states that in “direct response” to her filing of the amended complaint, the Subject Judge “or some other party has threatened me with a form of false arrest which effectively denies me access to file papers at the public counter which did not occur with the filing of the original petition.” Complainant also appears to allege that the Subject Judge “[p]rovok[ed] local law enforcement into further crimes against” her. Finally, Complainant raises allegations that involve individuals who are not federal judges.

Discussion

Complainant provides no credible facts or evidence in support of her claims that the Subject Judge engaged in misconduct.

The Complaint “is based on allegations lacking sufficient evidence to raise an inference that misconduct has occurred or that a disability exists,” JCDR 11(c)(1)(D). For that reason, pursuant to Chapter 16 of Title 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(iii) and Rule 11(c)(1)(D) of the Rules for Judicial-Conduct and Judicial-Disability Proceedings of the Judicial Conference of the United States, this Complaint is **DISMISSED**.
