ORDER

_____ (“Complainant”) has filed this Complaint against United States District Judge _____ (the “Subject Judge”), pursuant to Chapter 16 of Title 28 U.S.C. § 351(a) and the Rules for Judicial-Conduct and Judicial-Disability Proceedings of the Judicial Conference of the United States (“JCDR”).

Complaint

In his Complaint of Judicial Misconduct or Disability, Complainant appears to complain about the Subject Judge’s actions as a judge on the _____. He states he: (1) has been harassed, tortured, slandered, and followed for years; (2) believes the Foreign Intelligence Surveillance Act has been “used for purposes other than it was made”; and (3) believes the Subject Judge has given orders “wrongfully without due process.”

Discussion

Complainant provides no credible facts or evidence in support of his claims that the Subject Judge gave orders “wrongfully without due process” or otherwise engaged in misconduct.

The Complaint “is based on allegations lacking sufficient evidence to raise an inference that misconduct has occurred or that a disability exists,” JCDR 11(c)(1)(D). For that reason, pursuant to Chapter 16 of Title 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(iii) and Rule 11(c)(1)(D) of the Rules for Judicial-Conduct and Judicial-Disability Proceedings of the Judicial Conference of the United States, this Complaint is **DISMISSED**.
