ORDER

_____ (“Complainant”) has filed this Complaint against United States Magistrate Judge _____ (“the Subject Judge”), under the Act, 28 U.S.C. § 351(a), and the Rules for Judicial-Conduct and Judicial-Disability Proceedings of the Judicial Conference of the United States (“Judicial-Conduct Rules”).

Complaint

Complainant states that “the system” is “rigged,” and he cites two lawsuits that he filed where the Subject Judge was the magistrate judge. He does not otherwise raise any specific allegations against the Subject Judge.

Discussion

Complainant provides no credible facts or evidence in support of a claim that the Subject Judge engaged in misconduct.

The Complaint “is based on allegations lacking sufficient evidence to raise an inference that misconduct has occurred or that a disability exists,” under Judicial-Conduct Rule 11(c)(1)(D). For that reason, this Complaint is **DISMISSED**.
