ORDER

An individual has filed a Complaint against a United States district judge under the Judicial Conduct and Disability Act of 1980, 28 U.S.C. §§ 351–364, and the Rules for Judicial-Conduct and Judicial-Disability Proceedings of the Judicial Conference of the United States.

Background

In her judicial complaint, Complainant alleges that her complaint concerns the Subject Judge's conduct in three cases. But the record establishes that the Subject Judge was not involved in any of those cases or in any other case where Complainant was the plaintiff.

Complaint

Complainant asserts the Subject Judge "is directly related through family" to another family "connected to" her ex-husband

whom she named in complaints and police reports. She states the Subject Judge "has successfully kept" her complaints from proceeding beyond the initial pleading stage, and she requests an investigation into claims that he "is not judging her fairly, equally and without personal bias under the law."

Discussion

The Complaint fails to present a basis for a finding of misconduct. Complainant's claims are based on allegations lacking sufficient evidence to raise an inference that the Subject Judge engaged in misconduct. Judicial-Conduct Rule 11(c)(1)(D). For that reason, this Complaint is **DISMISSED**.
