ORDER

An individual has filed a Complaint against a United States district judge under the Judicial Conduct and Disability Act of 1980, 28 U.S.C. §§ 351–364, and the Rules for Judicial-Conduct and Judicial-Disability Proceedings of the Judicial Conference of the United States.

Background

The record shows that a federal grand jury issued an indictment charging two defendants with multiple crimes, and a superseding indictment was later issued adding another defendant. The Subject Judge was assigned to the case and issued various orders. The case remains pending.

Complaint

Complainant asserts that the Subject Judge made "[c]ountless errors . . . of the most basic nature" in criminal cases over which she presided, that "[d]ozens of highly respectable judges" have stated she is "inexperienced and incompetent," that her decisions "are being delayed far longer on basic matters of law and without proper substantiation," and that she is inept and exhibited "flagrant bias."

Discussion

The Complaint fails to present a basis for a finding of misconduct. Complainant's claims are based on allegations lacking sufficient evidence to raise an inference that the Subject Judge engaged in misconduct. Judicial-Conduct Rule 11(c)(1)(D). For that reason, this Complaint is **DISMISSED**.
