ORDER

An individual has filed a Complaint against three United States district judges under the Judicial Conduct and Disability Act of 1980, 28 U.S.C. §§ 351–364, and the Rules for Judicial-Conduct and Judicial-Disability Proceedings of the Judicial Conference of the United States.

Background

It does not appear that Complainant has been involved in any cases before the Subject Judges.

Complaint

Complainant states he is seeking to file an “administrative claim,” and he alleges that the Subject Judges prevented individuals with mental disabilities from obtaining damages through civil litigation, “failed to implement or maintain equal access to justice,” failed to provide public access to legal libraries and to court

dockets, failed to provide deposition services to *in forma pauperis* litigants, and violated the United States Constitution.

Discussion

The Complaint fails to present a basis for a finding of misconduct. Complainant's claims are based on allegations lacking sufficient evidence to raise an inference that the Subject Judges engaged in misconduct. Judicial-Conduct Rule 11(c)(1)(D). For that reason, this Complaint is **DISMISSED**.
