ORDER

An individual has filed a Complaint against a United States district judge under the Judicial Conduct and Disability Act of 1980, 28 U.S.C. §§ 351–364, and the Rules for Judicial-Conduct and Judicial-Disability Proceedings of the Judicial Conference of the United States.

Background

The record establishes that Complainant filed in state court a civil complaint against one defendant, and the defendant removed the case to federal court. After Complainant filed an amended complaint, the Subject Judge entered an order dismissing the federal claims with prejudice and remanding the state-law claims. On appeal, this Court affirmed.

Complaint

Complainant states she is petitioning to determine why a brief was sent from the district court to this Court. She states she received a letter that she filed a brief in her appeal, but that she only sent a brief to “the office on record.”

Discussion

The Complaint fails to present a basis for a finding of misconduct. Complainant provides no facts or evidence in support of a claim that the Subject Judge engaged in misconduct. Judicial-Conduct Rule 11(c)(1)(D). For this reason, this Complaint is **DISMISSED**.
