ORDER

An individual has filed a Complaint against a United States magistrate judge under the Judicial Conduct and Disability Act of 1980, 28 U.S.C. §§ 351–364, and the Rules for Judicial-Conduct and Judicial-Disability Proceedings of the Judicial Conference of the United States.

Complaint

Complainant alleges the Subject Judge “violated secret ballot information and the protection of voter ballots releasing information to individuals not allowed to possess such information ...,” which was a “political based action, to commit fraud and it is illegal to release secret ballots outside the area where they are counted/store[d].” Complainant also states, “This was a political, bias, arbitrary ruling, a violation of CANONS, her oath, the Constitution, and ethics. I want her removed from the bench and her lawyer license[] revoked. I criminally charged her as well. Our

voting rights, and the right to our votes being secret/confidential, will not be violated.” Complainant does not provide a citation to a particular case in which the Subject Judge was involved.

Discussion

The Complaint fails to present a basis for a finding of misconduct. Complainant’s claims are based on allegations lacking sufficient evidence to raise an inference that the Subject Judge engaged in impermissible political activity, committed a crime, engaged in fraud, was biased, violated her oath of office or the Code of Conduct for United States Judges, or otherwise engaged in misconduct. Judicial-Conduct Rule 11(c)(1)(D). For that reason, this Complaint is **DISMISSED**.
